Regional Area:

Eastern Regional Commission on the Status of Women includes the towns of Avon, Brookline, Canton, Cohasset, Dedham, Foxborough, Holbrook, Milton, Plainville, Randolph, Sharon, Stoughton, and Westwood, and the cities of Boston, Braintree, Chelsea, Quincy, Revere, Weymouth, and Winthrop.

Meetings:

The Commission held 7 meetings on July 19, February 3, March 3, April 7, May 5, May 11, May 15. There was no quorum at the July 19 and February 3 meetings.

Advocacy:

The group did not advocate for any specific legislation this year. However, at the meeting with the Massachusetts Caucus of Women we brought forward concerns of mental health and reproductive health and access. We gained much information from the Legislative breakfast, which is discussed below.

Programming:

Legislative breakfast

On May 21, 2022, the Commission hosted a breakfast event to honor the work of school nurses, and bring together nurses, educators, advocates, and legislators to discuss how COVID has impacted the healthcare and education of women and girls in the Eastern

region of the Commonwealth. The event was held at Florian Hall, 55 Hallet Street, Dorchester.

Nurses honored: Jill Connolly, Braintree Public Schools; Dr. Mary Jane O'Brien, Boston Public Schools; Dr. Patricia Johnson, Director of the M.Ed. Program-Cambridge College.

The following issues arose during the conversations as the most important for women and girls in our region, and will guide our legislative direction next year.

- Many stories from the school nurses about the bridging and healthcare made it clear what nurses do and the impact they have-these professionals have to wear many different hats and many people are unaware of the work they do, they are "Janes of all trades." .
- Teachers and nurses, and women in general, are not able to help students when overwhelmed by trying to do it all, and there is a need to be brave and advocate for themselves.
- Teachers and nurses make a difference for students in more ways than providing education and healthcare. Connectedness and bringing in trauma informed care and social emotional learning is important.
- Children do not leave their community at that door, they bring it in with them. Concerns nurses shared about students and their families include: mental health and attitude of this topic in immigrant families; severe increase in mental health needs and stigma; adolescents becoming more aggressive, anxious and/or depressed and not having the skills to communicate; increases in youth suicide, LGBTQ students feel increasingly isolated; the impact of social media on students; and housing security.
- We need short -term and long -term game plans for recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, including retention and recruiting people in these professions (paraprofessionals, teachers, and nurses) which will requires more money and support. There has been a mass exodus of nurses to become traveling nurses, due to compensation levels and for security, since the front line workers are the ones whose jobs get cut.
