Supporting schools in retaining **local control** to select curriculum and instructional materials and to determine the age that sex and relationship education begins



Allowing parents the option to review the curriculum and opt their child out of instruction



Collecting **data** on the sexual health education being offered in schools and keeping the Massachusetts Comprehensive Health Curriculum Framework updated
